WHY I REALLY STARTED THE ASSOCIATION

As I started researching Sun Communities, I wanted to find out what other Sun properties were experiencing around the country in their communities. What I found were page after



page of complaints that sounded a whole lot like what could, and is happening here. It seemed like they all stemmed around three major complaints: Exhorbitant increases in rent, eliminating services, and not following up on resident issues. With the \$50 increase in my rent this year, if they continue with these increases, within 8 years I'll be paying \$1000 per month for a slab. Don't take my word for it, just Google "Sun Community Complaints." I also created a new Complaint Page where I randomly took several dozen complaints from around the country for you to review. Feel free to voice yours.

I have no power here. They won't even respond to my emails. In fact, I'm not very well liked by Management and Sun. They don't want the Association here because they don't want to be monitored, and called out for decisions they make that affects our Community. They look at us as nothing more than rent. If they treat the Association this way, an organization that does nothing but want to help their residents experience a better quality of life, I imagine they're treating you the same way. But I will at least remain one voice to stick up for, and stand behind my Neighbors. I don't want a big uprising against the Corporate Goliath, but you need to feel comfortable complaining if you have an issue. Remember, the squeeky wheel gets the oil. Don't let Sun walk all over you. They will if you let them.

PARAGRAPH A ON YOUR LEASE

A. Minor Repairs: The TENANT is responsible for all minor repairs, including but not limited to: toilet leaks, running toilets, faucet drips, furnace filter replacements, carpet and floor cleaning and upkeep, general home cleaning, pest control, wall repairs for nail and screw holes, lawn upkeep (including mowing, weeding and trimming), replacing dislodged skirting panels, replacing light bulbs, touchup painting, or any damage done to the home by the tenant or its guest(s).

I read through the Michigan Legislatures Rules for Landlord/Tenant rights regarding this, and their explanation wasn't clear. Some say that renters, according to the law, do not have to pay for minor repairs and others say they should. I don't think they should and here's why?
