# THE BAD NEWS

I really have to apologize to the Community. I truly thought I had a shot at bringing us together, and form a neighborhood that was worth living in. But the numbers didn't lie. Out of 250 homes we only received 36 FREE registrations. And when I asked for donations and started a GoFundMe Page, out of 250 homes we received 3 donations. Most of the donations we did get came from my golf league, and that will go to keeping the website running and creating the monthly newsletter. That's ok. I asked the CEO of Sun Communities for a donation, and as usual was ignored. So I think what the residents and Sun Communities is basically telling me is that the Association isn't really wanted. I'll still continue to disagree. If I can't affect 250 homes, maybe I can affect one person at a time. Bottom-line: I won't be able to put on the type of events I envisioned without money, so we won't be offering any events or programs this year, free or otherwise. But we'll still be here when you need us for some help, or when you just need someone to talk to.

And, I unfortunately learned that good deeds don't always get rewarded. I loaned my lawn equipment to a neighbor who said he couldn't afford a cutting, and he stole them. Had to buy new ones. If this person would like to return my equipment on my patio, I would appreciate it.

#### **BUILDING A BARN**

At one point in time, I actually envisioned our Community taking examples from the Amish culture. If a neighbor needed a barn, he didn't need to go out and beg for help. The whole Community, carpenters, plumbers, electricians and cooks would come to his aid and help build the barn. They never asked for money because it was a labor of love. More importantly, he was their Neighbor.

#### THE GOOD NEWS

The Association accomplished some nice things this year:

- We started the Snow Removal for Seniors Program - Retained (Malcom Wells) to personally handle grass cutting through the Association - Collected 89 cans for the Hunger Drive - Helped paint several Seniors homes - Helped several neighbors create a garden - Gave away free plants last month - Linda introduced the Weatherization Program to Seniors and, we incorporated The Smile and Wave.
