WHO BETTER TO LEARN FROM

The very title of the series, Mister Rogers' Neighborhood, invokes feelings of warmth and closeness from the very beginning. Mister Rogers greets everyone whom he meets as a Neighbor, as a friend, and as someone upon whom he clearly bestows kindness and compassion. If there is something you need don't hesitate to ask. If you like to cut your own lawn, I will rent you my

lawn mower, trimmer, blower and batteries for only \$10. This is not so you can start your own lawn cutting business. Lawn cutting will be the same price as last year, \$20 no matter how large your property. This money along with donations help pay for the Newsletter, Website Hosting etc.

APRIL IS THE MONTH TO START GARDENING

If ever there was a month to spend more time planting in the garden, it's April. I'm getting more complaints that Neighbors are having their packages stolen off their porches. I don't know why Management isn't addressing this crime, but Mr. Mike's Neighborhood is. Normally, Neighbors will be informed by the delivery company that a package has been delivered. All you need to do is send me a text and I'll pick the package up and bring it to my home. You can pick it up from here. This is a free service that I hope will eliminate the theft that's occuring in our Community.

We are also having cars broken into. The only way to handle this is to have an alarm installed on your vehicle with signs on your windows, and keep your eyes open for individuals that look like they're scouting the area. If you are a victim, immediately call the police and then the office. The office should know what's happening in our Community.

WHY DO PEOPLE LOWER THEIR HEADS WHEN THEY PASS YOU ON THE STREET?

When you see Linda and I taking our daily walk, we love saying "Hi Neighbor" to everyone we pass. We don't have to know your name or have a lengthy conversation. But in our Community, we are all Neighbors. It's difficult to do this to strangers outside our Community, but anytime you pass by your Neighbor on our streets, don't be afraid to say a simple "Hi Neighbor." It really does make a difference for developing a Neighborhood Culture. We practice this every day with our Smile and Wave Program.
