GRASS CUTTING TIME GETTING CLOSE - I NEED YOUR SUPPORT!

As we've done for the past several years, we will continue to cut grass within our Community. As most of you know, we don't take donations to support Mr. Mike's Neighborhood, not because we can't use more money, but because we know how tight money may be for you. So we use grass cutting to help with our expenses.

If you sign up with the Park's grass cutting program, you will pay \$68 for four cuts per month added on to your rent. Most grass doesn't need to be cut every week, so you could be wasting money. We charge \$20 per cut, which incudes cutting, edging and cleaning. We also cut the weeds in your sidewalk which the Park program won't do. So if we cut your grass twice a month, that's \$40, which will save you \$28 per month. Not only that, we have several ways to pay. We take Cash, Credit Cards, CashApp, and most importantly, if you need your grass cut but you don't have the money, you can go on our Honor Program and pay when you can. Let's keep our money in the Park as compared to hiring outside concerns.

To have us cut your grass, all you need to do is text me your first name, house number and how you will pay. If you're already a customer I have your contact information. We don't set permanent times since all grass doesn't grow at the same rate, so we rely on you to let us know when you feel it's time by texting us. But do not let your grass grow high or Park Management will be contacting you. If you get a Thursday or Friday note on your door regarding Force Cut, do take this seriously. If you don't cut it by the next Monday, they will charge you \$55 for them to cut it as a fine.

DONTATIONS OF CLOTHES, TOYS, FOOD AND MORE

Mr. Mike's Neighborhood has been so lucky having Neighbors who gladly donate items that our entire Community can use. We actually don't want you throwing anything away without asking whether our Neighbors can use them. So because of the quantity of donations, we will put them on the sidewalk in front of my home only on weekends. Whatever is not taken by then, we will donate to a Charity. Our only requirement is that clothes must be washed and it good condition.

If you have something to donate, you can just leave it on my porch and we'll take care of it. Miss Linda and I would just like to say "THANKS IN ADVANCE FOR ALL YOUR HELP."

MY NORTH LAFAYETTE NEIGHBORS

Our Community is split between North and South Lafayette Blvds. Because of where I'm located, I only have the pleasure of seeing and meeting my South Lafayette Neighbors as they pass by my home. With the restrictions Sun Communities places on me, if I step on your property, I'm accused of trespassing. If I knock on your door, I'm accused of resident annoyance. If I ask for donations, I'm accused of running a business in the Park. So Sun Communities has pretty much relegated me to my small part of the Community.

So if you live on North Lafayette, please detour toward my home on weekends to see if i have any donations you can use.

After speaking with many of you, I realized that fear and retaliation from Sun Communities was the main reason why you wouldn't speak up. But I'm over it now. Miss Linda and I will continue to promote reading for our children with our Free Children's Library, make sure that anyone who needs food can visit our Free Food Pantry, and continute to repurpose items donated to share with everyone on the weekends.
